umbrella term describe a variety of developmental disorders characterized by significant difficulties in social relationships, communication, repetitive behaviors, and over restrictive interests. impact 1 in 500 children. higher rate of these disorders in children with family members who are also affected indicating strong genetic component. boys are 4 times more likely to be affected as girls. these kids usually exhibit mild to severe or profound secondary language impairment

Chapter 6: language disorders in early and later childhood ...

Onset of Unspecified Communication Disorder. The DSM-5 does not specify the age of onset of UCD. Communication disorders are part of the neurodevelopmental disorder spectrum, so the typical age of onset will be early childhood (American Psychiatric Association, 2013).

A communication disorder is any disorder that affects an individual's ability to comprehend, detect, or apply language and speech to engage in discourse effectively with others. The delays and disorders can range from simple sound substitution to the inability to understand or use one's

native language.

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
