Work Organization Hazards: Safety hazards or stressors that cause stress (short-term effects) and strain (long-term effects). These are hazards associated with workplace issues such as workload, lack of control and/or respect, etc.

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Employers subject to the OSH Act also have a general duty to provide work and a workplace free from recognized, serious hazards. OSHA also administers the Whistleblower Protection

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program, ensuring an employer cannot retaliate by taking "adverse action" against workers who report injuries, safety concerns, or other protected activity.

OSHA must be notified within 8 hours of a work-related fatality, and within 24 hours of an amputation, loss of an eye, or inpatient hospitalization. Action item 5: Identify hazards associated with emergency and nonroutine situations. Emergencies present hazards that need to be recognized and understood.

You have the right to be informed of known or foreseeable hazards in the workplace and to be provided with the information, instructions, training, and supervision necessary to protect your health and safety. The Code requires the use of appropriate methods of communication for all employees including those with special needs.

Biological work hazards may occur if workers are exposed to living organisms or properties, such as parasites, viruses, fungi and bacteria. When we refer to hazards in relation to occupational safety and health the most commonly used definition is ' A Hazard is a potential source of harm or adverse health effect on a person or persons'. The terms Hazard and Risk are often used interchangeably but this simple example explains the difference between the two.
