Workers should wash hands with soap and water immediately after removing PPE. The following PPE is recommended for workers handling human waste or sewage: Goggles: to protect eyes from splashes of human waste or sewage. Protective face mask or splash-proof face shield: to protect nose and mouth from splashes of human waste or sewage.

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A vaccination program should be in place where there is a significant risk of exposure to Hepatitis A or Tetanus (eg workers in regular contact with sewage). The Australian Immunisation Handbook recommends vaccinations for Hepatitis A and Tetanus (as dT or dTpa - ie with Diphtheria +/- Pertussis) for these workers.

### Best practice guidance for reducing health risk for ...

Generally, rubber gloves, aprons, boots, and face masks may be necessary to prevent contact with waste water. Employers must determine what tasks require these and/or other PPE. You mentioned in your letter that, in addition to working in the waste water treatment area, you also worked as a laboratory assistant.
